What is covered in the CISM TEAM Development Workshop? Who should attend?

The Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) Team development Program is for emergency service personnel, community health workers, social workers, and front-line workers who have **completed the BASIC and PEER CISM Programs** and desire to learn more about developing a CISM Response Team:

- How to decide if a team is needed
- Components of a CISM Team
- Team roles/responsibilities
- Team Protocols and Policies
- Team Member Screening Process
- Forming a team (Team Structure)
- Team Training Needs
- Team Registry with ICISF
- Team Financial Needs

In most cases, CISM teams are voluntary partnerships between various individuals and groups who work together to achieve common goals – lessening the impact of traumatic stress, accelerating the recovery from stressful events, and enhancing the psychological health of emergency and front-line workers. This workshop will enable participants to understand the necessary components for the development of an effective CISM team, which includes the support and participation from both mental health professionals and community leaders.
