These two (2) Fire Safety Education programs are utilized to support our presentations to Schools and Communities:

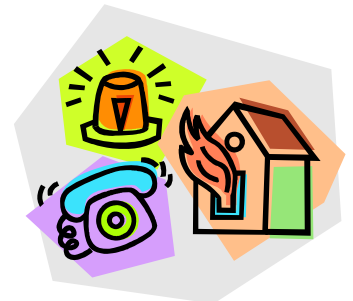
Learn Not To Burn®
