Fire Prevention Week (FPW) October 9-15, 2022 Grades 2-4

Thank you for being part of the FNESS team, bringing lifesaving fire safety information to children and their families. With your help and the resources in this package, learning how to stay safe from fire can be easy and fun!



For Students

1. Smoke Alarms and Escape Routes Activity

This activity teaches children the importance of having working smoke alarms in the home. Should there be a fire, smoke alarms provide an early warning so that families can get out quickly and safely. For best coverage, there should be one on each level of the home and in each sleeping area. Fire is very fast and if there is a fire ... every second counts. Knowing two ways out of every room increases the chances that everyone will get out quickly and safely.

Provide a copy of the activity sheet to each child. This activity can be done individually, in pairs, or as a class. Review responses when complete using the answer key provided as a guide.

2. Fire Safety Quiz

This quiz serves as a teaching tool for simple fire safety behaviours.

We recommend the quiz be used as a class activity to promote discussion and ensure understanding of correct responses. An answer key has been provided.

For Families

1. Family Home Escape Planning Assignment

This family assignment targets the importance of home escape planning and ensuring working smoke alarms are in the home. Adults play a significant leadership role in this regard.

Provide a copy of the family assignment to your students and ask them to give it to their parents/caregivers. This homework should be done as a family and signed off as their commitment to fire safety.

2. Contest Entry

Once families have developed their home escape plan and completed the home escape plan checklist, they can enter to win a family prize!

Directions for entering the draw are in the assignment.


For You

Remember to draw in a family meeting place outside the home!



Fire Safety Quiz

ANSWER KEY

1.	Young children should use matches only when older children are with them.	FALSE – Children should never use matches or lighters. When they see them, they should tell an adult and ask them to put them away.
2.	If your clothes catch on fire, you should run and call for help.	FALSE – You must stop, drop, and roll and cover your face with your hands. Fire needs air to burn and rolling on the ground takes away the air.
3.	When you hear the sound of the smoke alarm, you must get out of your house right away.	TRUE – A smoke alarm can smell the smoke before our noses can. Smoke and fire spreads fast so you must escape immediately.
4.	You should plan two ways our of every room.	TRUE – If one exit is blocked with smoke, use the second exit. Plan with your parents/caregivers to make sure both exits are safe to use.
5.	If a pan on the stove catches on fire, the best thing to do is put water on it.	FALSE – To put the fire out take the air away by putting a lid on the pan. Water will cause an explosion and spread the fire.
6.	Smoke alarms need to be tested at least once per month and vacuumed regularly.	TRUE – Smoke alarms need to be tested to make sure the batteries work. They also need to be vacuumed to work properly.
7.	If you burn your skin, put ice on it.	FALSE – Cool the burn with cool water for 10-15 minutes. Cool water stops the burning and the hurt. Ice can freeze the skin.
8.	Always sleep with your bedroom door closed.	TRUE – A closed door stops the smoke from coming into your room. This gives you time to use your second exit.
9.	When escaping a fire crawl low under the smoke.	TRUE – Smoke rises so the air closest to the floor is the cleanest.
10.	It's okay if candles are burning and no one is in the room.	FALSE – Lit candles need adult supervision. When they are left unattended they can cause a fire.






