## Temporary Emergency Assignment Management System

The First Nations' Emergency Services Society - Temporary Emergency Assignment Management System (FNESS-TEAMS) program is for First Nations to help other First Nations during an emergency.

The program is aligned with Priority 2 Section 12 of the *Action Plan for Disaster Risk Reduction* by First Nations in BC 2023-2030.

"Neighboring First Nations: First Nations working together and sharing information, personnel, and equipment when possible is invaluable when a disaster strikes.

a. It is recommended that: (1) communities develop and share DRR/EM inventories (such as equipment, sheltering/hosting capacity, etc.) of the resources that could be deployed;"

The TEAMS program is made up of members of First Nations administration and/or Emergency Management (EM) programs that have experience in Emergency Operation Centre (EOC) activations in any of the functions/positions (e.g., operations, finance, logistics, etc.) and those with experience in Emergency Support Services (ESS) having supported evacuees through those processes.

Candidates are either employed by the First Nation or are a volunteer with their EM/ESS program and have the permission of their administration to participate.



### First Nations' Emergency Services Society of BC

This is a pilot project and FNESS will cover the costs associated with the deployment.

Pay will be at the FNESS casual employee rate.

Candidates will require a valid BC drivers license and must be willing to travel.
